W: You put so much time and effort into your studies, but the results are disappointing. This could happen just because you lack the ability to concentrate. In other words, if you're unable to stay focused, your brain won't perform well no matter how hard you try. If you're having trouble with concentration, the following may come in handy. Most of all, make sure you get enough sleep. This is the key step for improving your concentration. Next, always have a plan for whatever you are working on. When you sit down without a plan, you may easily get distracted by activities like checking your phone messages or emails. Also, eat a balanced diet and do not overeat. Overeating can make you feel uncomfortable and tired. Eating light and healthy meals can help you maintain your ability to concentrate. Finally, studies have shown that people who exercise regularly have a greater ability to concentrate. So if you feel your concentration is lacking, you might want to head to the gym.
